**BRUSHING AND FLOSSING AND RINSING – OH MY!
THE LOUISIANA CHILDREN'S MUSEUM BRINGS
FLUORIDE FUN WITH FETCH! DENTAL SCIENCE SATURDAY, FEB. 26**

New Orleans, LA– The Louisiana Children's Museum (LCM) will bring Fluoride fun on **Saturday, February 26** from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. with **Fetch! Dental Science**.

The LCM Fetch! exhibit is based on the popular kids' reality show on PBS called Fetch! The show sends kids out into the real world to test their wits with interesting challenges, prompting them to conduct experiments and investigate the world around them. Now kids can experience this engaging approach to science right here at LCM. The exhibit, ideal for ages six to ten, gives kids the opportunity to participate in Fetch!-style activities whenever they come to the Museum.

Visitors can:

- Participate in a soda cavity experiment. Guess how much sugar is in one can of soda and test your hypothesis in the Museum Atrium on the first floor
- Let the Museum's Stuffedie Show illustrate how the food you eat can effect the health of your gums and teeth in the Museum Atrium on the first floor
- Learn about the acidity levels in what you drink and how it affects your teeth in the Atrium on the first floor
- Make your own tiny tooth fairy in the Museum Atrium on the first floor
- Create SMILE art with simple materials in the Museum's ArtTrek Studio on the second floor
- Wish you lived above a grocery store? Build your own corner storehouse in the *New Orleans Proud to Call it Home* Architecture Exhibit on the Museum's second floor

Since 1986, the Louisiana Children's Museum has engaged children and families in memorable, interactive experiences that make growing and learning fun. It also goes beyond its walls to deliver creative, educational resources that impact the greater New Orleans community. The Museum is located at 420 Julia Street in New Orleans' warehouse district.
